1911 aficionados like the P238 for its trigger and laser activation. It was the best of the bunch in those functions. Ease in concealment took slightly more effort than the others.



Most of these laser-fitted pocket pistols had small grips, and a tucked small finger was the best way to control them. The P238's laser sight had a bolted-on look.



The SIG had the best activation button; it was ambidextrous and was easiest to use with just a slight push.



Sights are still required on laser-equipped pistol. At left, the Ruger's were rudimentary at best, yet the pistol was easy to conceal. The SIG's (right) were big, large, and glowed in the dark — but were snag prone, which impedes draw. That's not what most of us want in a deep-conceal gun.
