Glock G30SF Glock G19 ISSC M22



Above: Glock pistols are generally thought of as being blocky. But the Model 19 felt much smaller than its larger-caliber brother, the GL30SF, which shares the same basic frame size. In comparison, to the right is the ISSC Austria M22 tested in our May issue, which bears a strong resemblance to the G19. Yet the 22 LR M22 was wider than the Model 19 9mm as well.
