

**RUGER SP101 #5759 327 FEDERAL MAGNUM,
\$600-\$800**

GUN TESTS GRADE: A-

The SP101 in 327 Fed Mag performed well, and the added capacity and adjustable rear sight made this a desirable revolver. Ammo availability might be an issue.

The 327 Fed Mag offers less recoil than the 357 Mag revolvers but it still has some pop. The pistol also chambers and fires 32 H&R Mag and 32 S&W, but they can be more difficult to find than 327 Fed Mag. We're guessing that Ruger discontinued this because it didn't sell all that well, but that's not fault of the handgun.



Both Rugers had a more hand-filling rubber grip that absorbed felt recoil.
